Dear Kaiser Families,

This week we will have an assembly on Wednesday to hear students give speeches in honor of Black History Month. Most were in the MLK Oratorical Fest competition earlier this month, and this will be a chance for them to perform for us!

Last week we had 2 assemblies celebrating African American History and some of the classes had other instructional pieces. I heard about several families in which there was some confusion or troubling thoughts brought home by the children, reflecting the child's incomplete understanding of the presentations. The parents called the school or asked me questions, and after my investigations the situations all turned out to be children only having part of the picture in their memory. While it is perfectly fine to question what is being taught to your children, I'm asking that you keep in mind that children often do not remember everything from a presentation (do any of us?) and that teachers will often complete instructional pieces over several days. As a faculty we will also discuss this issue further on Wednesday during our staff development time, emphasizing the need to check for thorough understanding.

Were you there? Did you see it? I'm talking about the African American Celebration and Potluck this past Friday evening. We had lots of good food and great fellowship. We saw a play about civil rights by the 5<sup>th</sup> graders. (Thanks, Mr. Neat!) And we continued to build upon our friendships and social network that we call the Kaiser Community.

It's time for a few reminders. Everyone is expected to follow our rules for the safety of all!

- Phones and electronics will be confiscated and returned to parents.
- No gum ever.
- No students may be on the playground prior to 8:30. **After school children can be on the yard only until 3:15 and only if supervised by their parent.** After 3:15, the yard is contracted to Adventure Time and only Adventure Time staff and students will be allowed on the yard.
- In the morning students and parents should walk around the building to get to the playground between 8:15 and 8:40 to allow teachers final preparation time before school.
- After school, students are to **sit** at the picnic tables (**the Waiting Zone**) in front of the school to wait for their rides.

Our most recent attendance data show that we average about 97% attendance each month. If we brought that up to 98% it would mean about \$13,000 more in our annual budget per year. Although we understand keeping your child home when sick, please bring them for a partial day when they have appointments and try your best to schedule personal business to non-school days. Please help us by having your child attend every day!

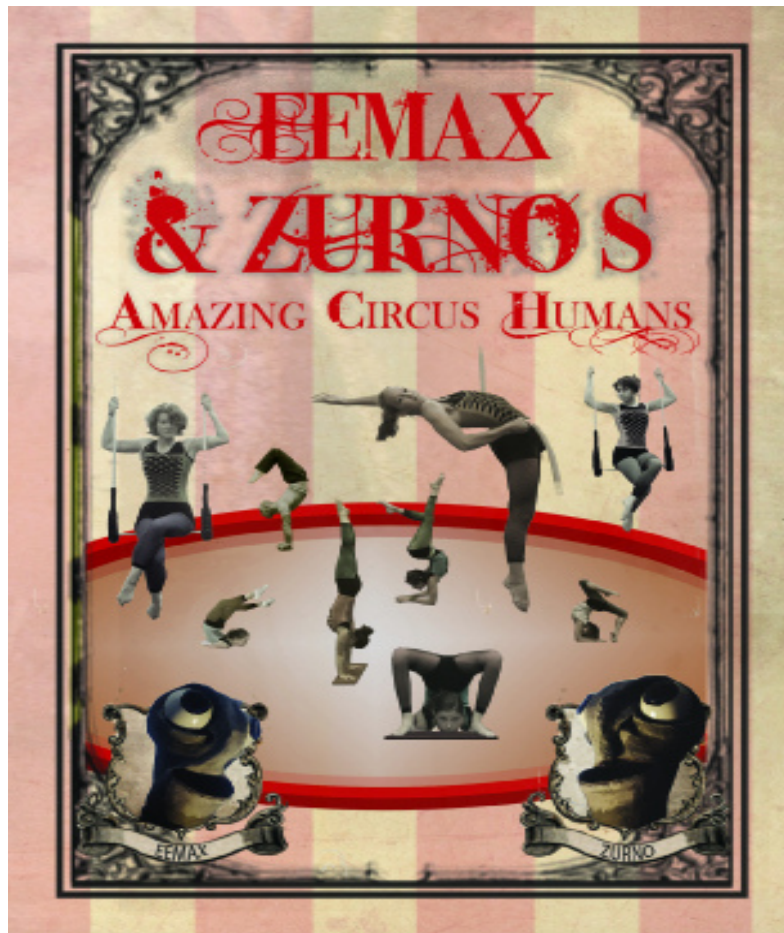

# Let's get busy, Kaiser School!

We all know the importance of being active. It stimulates your mind, keeps you fit, and helps prevent diseases. But, how about enjoying activities simply because they are FUN? There are so many awesome things to do both outside and inside that will keep your brain fresh and creative.

Once again, we have created for the students at Kaiser a passport to good health that will give them opportunities to be active and participate in a program in which they will be rewarded. Starting April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2010, your child may use this booklet of suggestions for ways to stay fit, in mind and body. They can choose from activities that encourage them to play on their own, or they may select a page that will get them out in the community or enjoying fun things with the family.

The passport booklet takes into account every age group from K – 5<sup>th</sup> grade. That way everyone can participate and have a chance to win fabulous prizes.

Each year we begin the festivities by holding a cover art contest. The student who represents the program the best will have his/her artwork displayed on the cover of the Passport booklet. The entry forms were passed out in class last week and we ask to have them back by Monday Mar 8<sup>th</sup>. Just in case the original failed to make it home in one piece there is a copy of the form with this message. Please remember, the winning artwork is chosen less by skill and more by vision. We love seeing how the children represent their thoughts.

We have some great prizes to give out at the end of the ALIVE program, and we want EVERYONE to qualify for the prize drawing at the end of the year! In order to do that, we need you as a parent, coach, or teacher to witness and validate the child's passport on the line at the bottom of the appropriate page.

One passport is required for each student at Kaiser School.

Their name will be entered in a drawing to win prizes based on these levels:

- 100-149 points
- 150-199 points
- 200-249 points
- 250-299 points
- 300+ points

Each child will only be eligible for the drawing if they have earned the minimum 100 points. However, all students will earn a participation medal at our program-end celebration. Also, the student in each grade who earns the most points will take home a beautiful trophy!

Complete your booklet and return it to your teacher by Friday, May 14<sup>th</sup>, 2010.

Please encourage your child to fill as many pages as he/she can. The more they do, the better the prizes are at our end of program celebration on Friday, May 21<sup>st</sup>!
