### Message from Principal Katie McLane

Dear Families,

You certainly spoiled us last week! All week we had the most delicious taste treats brought by our wonderful families to be shared with all the staff. We had some prospective teachers visit us as well and they couldn't believe the support that our families provide!

Next week our fourth and fifth graders will have their Open House on Tuesday, May 23rd at 6:30 and then the instrumental music concert at 7:00. The jazz band will also perform that evening. We expect all 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade students and their families to be in attendance that evening.

The younger students will be performing on Wednesday, June 7<sup>th</sup>, with primarily a dance program. The Open House will be from 6:30 to 7:00, followed by the children's performances. There will also be a PTA meeting that evening and all parents are encouraged to stay to elect the officers and approve the preliminary PTA budget for next year. This will be a most important meeting.

Speaking of budgets, it appears that the governor is going to send back some of the money he borrowed from the education community three years ago. Oakland looks forward to the returned funds so that our budgets at the sites can begin to balance. When we submitted our preliminary budget, we were in the red for next year.

Last Saturday evening, our own Kaiser Miracle Choir joined with other Oakland Youth Chorus Miracle Choirs to perform a spectacular concert! We are blessed to have a very special director, Kelly Takunda Orphan, working with our students. It was also fun to see our alumni performing in the Middle School Choir.

Other good news: the Barrios Foundation has once again awarded Kaiser School an \$8,000 grant for our Orff music program in the primary grades and we will hear this week if we will have an Arts Anchor grant for next year. If so, we will be able to maintain the upper grade "wheel." We are discussing offering PE, Science, Social Studies and instrumental music for of the wheel next year.

Our thanks to the many parents who accompanied our first through third grade children on the Monterey Bay Aquarium field trip. It was a beautiful day and despite the long bus ride, there was much to be seen and learned. Our children, as always, were well behaved on this adventure. This month many of our classes are exploring sea life and this experience will make the learning much more real.

Standardized testing is almost completed and we ask that you return the information on the attached form (Student / Parent Information) so that we know that the information we send to the state is as accurate as possible. Look for the green form!

We hope that the Mother's Day weekend was a wonderful one for family closeness and we encourage you to join us on June 3<sup>rd</sup> for the retirement celebration.

Please note that an additional day has been added to the end of the school year, so now classes will extend through JUNE 15<sup>th</sup>.

- 3-4**   a three/four combination,
- 4-5**   a four/five combination and...
- 5**    a fifth grade.

When we put combination classes together, we seek to have students who can focus and work independently.

No teachers have been assigned to these classes yet as we need to complete the hiring and then make the appropriate assignments.

## **Katie McLane Retirement Gift Needs Volunteers!**

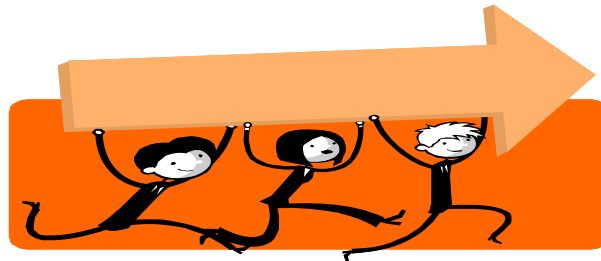
Money has been collected to rebuild the fence at Katie's home to keep the deer out. However, we need lots of helpers to get the job done.
