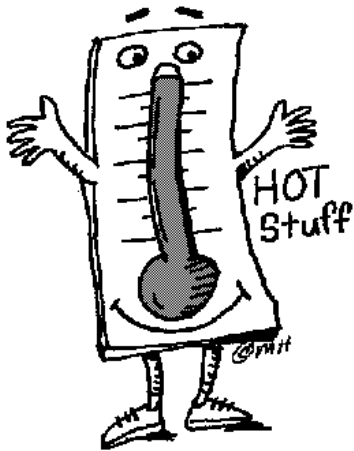

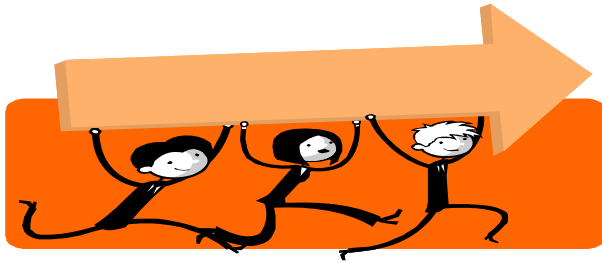
Money has been collected to rebuild the fence at Katie's home to keep the deer out. However, we need lots of helpers to get the job done.

Up to Date with Measure B ??

Hello Kaiser Parents and Teachers,

I am a parent of children at Chabot Elementary School, and co-chair of **the campaign for Measure B**, a \$430 million bond measure on the June 6 ballot. Passage of Measure B will allow OUSD to do repairs and renovations in Oakland's schools. As you know, the average Oakland school is 60 years old. If Oakland doesn't raise this money, which will qualify it for \$100 million in state matching funds, those matching funds will go to other cities. We would really like Kaiser to help us get the word out to parents about voting for Measure B on June 6. (I realize we may have missed your May PTA meeting, but we still would like help with informing folks in your community.)

Please contact me with any questions or comments. In case it helps, we have endorsements from the PTAs at Chabot, Hillcrest, and Crocker Highlands, as well as the Alameda County Democratic Central Committee and Senator Don Perata.
