Dear Kaiser Families,

A wonderful start for a wonderful school!

The opening of school went very well! Thanks to the hard work and cooperation of all the Kaiser community there were no crises and only minimal heartache—except in Kindergarten where I think some of the parents had a difficult time saying good-bye! Within minutes I could see our students with happy faces engaged in the business of childhood (learning) and becoming part of our community of learners.

There are a couple of practical issues that have arisen:

- We can only provide supervision for children after 8:30 a.m. and until 3:10 in the afternoon. I wish we had staffing for more coverage. I see as many as 50 kids here before 8:30. If you need additional time, please enroll your child in Adventure Time with Susanne, 845-3371.
- Lunch is \$2.00 and milk alone is \$.40
- School starts at 8:45 and there is no such thing as an excused tardy, meaning that it will go on the student's record.
- Please use cell phones outside. In the building we want all attention for the kids.
- Please help you child get the full benefit of our program by being here every day, all day, from 8:45-3:00.
- Unless you are a Kindergarten parent, we ask that you wait for your child either near the office or outside at the table area. That will avoid clogging the hallway.
- You can avoid the afternoon traffic circle by parking on Hiller Drive or North Hill Court.

Wednesday evening is Back-to-School Night!

- Time 6:30-8:30 General Information first in the multipurpose room, followed by sessions in the classrooms.
- Park on the upper field. There's plenty of room there.
- This is an adult event. Please do your best to not bring children as the evening's structure is a lot of "sit and listen" and then "question and answer", which is very boring for kids. And please don't let your children talk you into bringing them so they can play on the upper field; there will be no supervision.
- This is not a conference night; if you want a conference with your child's teacher, please contact them for an appointment.

Another theme we have this year is "Collaboration and Community." This summer three teachers (Janan Apaydin, Trish Gorham and Mary Grace McGhee) and I had the opportunity to attend 4 days of professional development in Boston on the topic of Professional Learning Community. The underlying concept of a "PLC" is that faculty members get regular time to examine student performance and their own practice in order to improve both. This year we have restructured our master schedule to give grade level

teachers a weekly period to meet to coordinate curriculum, review data and plan intervention for students. Of course, pulling in our parent community is another part of our learning community that we will be developing is really a sign, not that we are problem-free, but that we *work together* to solve challenges as they arise. On a more personal note, I am thrilled to return as your principal for a second year of serving you. For those that I disappointed last year, I apologize and will try harder to make decisions which are best for us all.
