Dear Kaiser Families,

Someone said to me recently that parenting is a thankless job. The comment caught me off guard because a "thankless job" is usually something that no one else wants to do. At my house cleaning out the refrigerator is a "thankless job." Picking up the litter off the front sidewalk is a "thankless job." A thankless job is something that you have to do because not doing it will cause more problems later, but no one really notices or appreciates your efforts. Nothing could be further from the truth regarding parenting.

In an effort to enrich and expand our parenting efforts our PTA has started a program called Kaiser ALIVE. The children all received passport booklets last Wednesday which describe different activities you can do with your children. The kids get points and prizes, but the real reward is that time you get to spend with your children doing something which is enjoyable and participating in life together. April 12 is Dear Day (Drop Everything and Read!), so it's an opportunity to read with your child. National Library week is April 13-19; what a wonderful thing it is to take your child to the library! Another activity in the booklet which is special to me is to help your child write a letter to a relative. Oh yes, it is a learning standard for the third and fourth grades, but it's much more than that. Imagine how it will warm someone's heart and add to your family's memory when your child takes the time to actually write a real letter.

These activities and more are described in the Kaiser ALIVE passport booklet. I applaud the efforts of our PTA to encourage activities which support our parenting efforts. The activities in this program help our children build relationships, develop values, and reflect on their personal growth. These are hugely important aspects of parenting which are not part of the official school curriculum.

True, very few people get recognized for their parenting efforts except on Mother's Day, Father's Day, and when we get really old. No one thanks us for our day-to-day routines and dedication, but people do notice. Your dedication shows up in how well your children grow, perform, and ultimately enjoy life. The time and effort that you put in on a daily basis reveals itself in the human being that you are creating. All your big efforts, all your sacrifices, and all the little things you do day in and day out, week after week, add up to your contribution to society. I believe that you truly are **creating a human being**, and that we are working together to **re-weave the fabric of our civilization**. This is hardly a "thankless job."

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Getting In The Know

Let's get busy, Kaiser School!

We all know the importance of being active. It stimulates your mind, keeps you fit, and helps prevent diseases. But how about enjoying activities simply because they are FUN? There are so many awesome things to do, both outside and inside, that will keep your brain fresh and creative.

We have created for the students at Kaiser a passport to good health that will give them opportunities to be active and participate in a program in which they will be rewarded. Starting April 2, 2008, your child may use this booklet of suggestions for ways to stay fit, in mind and body. They can choose from activities that encourage them to play on their own, or they may select a page that will get them out in the community or enjoying fun things with the family.

The passport booklet takes into account every age group from K - 5th grade. That way everyone can participate and have a chance to win fabulous prizes. We have some great prizes to give out at the end of the ALIVE program, and we want EVERYONE to qualify for the prize drawing at the end of the year! In order to do that, we need you as a parent, coach, or teacher to witness and validate the child's passport on the line at the bottom of the appropriate page.

One passport is required for each student at Kaiser School. Participants' names will be entered in a drawing to win prizes based on these levels:

- 100-149 points
- 150-199 points
- 200-249 points
- 250-299 points
- 300+ points

Each child will be eligible for the drawing only if s/he has earned the minimum 100 points. However, all students will earn a participation medal at our program-end celebration. Also, the student in each grade who earns the most points will win a beautiful trophy!

Teachers will collect the passports on Monday, May 19. Please encourage your child to fill as many pages as he/she can. The more they do, the better the prizes are at our end of program celebration on Friday, May 30! We are hoping that our children will experience something new and test their limits.
