We celebrate love!

This coming weekend many of us will celebrate Valentine's Day by giving expressions of love to our closest friends and family. Greeting card companies say about a *billion* Valentine cards will be sent or given this week. That made me wonder a bit about where it all came from, so I did a little research into its history and origins. Wow! The things we can learn with a few clicks on the Internet!

Some sources said that there was a priest in ancient times named Valentine who secretly performed marriages for Roman soldiers who were required to remain single—thus he was a real advocate of love. Other sources point to a Roman fertility holiday called Lupercalia during which a female goat (lupa) would be sacrificed to increase the fertility of the young people of the villages, and the Church wanted to take over the holiday and Christianize it. Whatever the reason, we've been celebrating the holiday since about 496 AD, a really long time.

But what *is* love? Love is hard to define. The wonderful writer C.S. Lewis (*The Chronicles of Narnia*) wrote about the four types of love: *storge*, *filia*, *eros*, and *agape*. (I don't know why he named them with Greek words!) *Storge* is affection of people who are together by chance or by family ties for things, as in, "I love my sister Janet." *Filia* is the friendship of those who share deep and common bonds, as in, "I love my best friend Bob because we sing together." *Eros* is the love that mates have for each other which usually includes physical intimacy as in, "I love my spouse." And *agape* is the unconditional, indestructible love that parents have for their children (and for those who are spiritual, that God has for people) as in, "I love my baby and nothing will ever take that away." There are all different kinds of love, filling our lives with happiness at different times and in different ways, and they are all good! Let's celebrate!

The greeting cards of these students often mention what they appreciate about each other.* We have that custom here too, so please watch your child's teacher's newsletter for details about what's happening this week in their rooms.

How can we help our kids appreciate it? One of the wonderful things I've witnessed in the classrooms is an activity called "Appreciations." The teacher quiets the class and then invites kids to publicly "appreciate" someone or something. It begins with things like, "I appreciate extra recess time." Then it progresses to deeper issues like, "I appreciate the way we all support each other in our class." This activity guides children in speaking their heart. What a wonderful world we would have if we all "appreciated" each other like that every day!

So here I go: I appreciate the way the parents in our community work so hard to support their kids and our school by giving their time, money, and vocal encouragements. I appreciate you all! Happy Valentine's Day!
