Dear Kaiser Families,

Conferences happened last week and it was a time for parents and teachers to meet and discuss efforts to support kids in their development for the rest of the school year. It was a time for us to encourage you not to get “tired” and to give it another push. If you missed out on the scheduled dates you can contact your child’s teacher to set up an appointment.

Last week we also had a School Site Council Meeting during which I described the current state of our achievement and our plans for next year. A condensed version: currently 62% of our kids are at or above benchmark in English/Language and 78% in math. This is about the same level we had on last year’s standardized test in May, so we’re hoping that these positive scores will translate on those tests too! We also reviewed the site plan for next year; most of our program will remain the same except that we will be asking you, through the PTA, to help cover some of the budget cuts.

We have a comprehensive intervention system and team of intervention personnel intended to provide support for children who need it. Although our resources are limited we can often help and sometimes refer parents to other sources of support. You can find out more about the whole system at our school’s website, [www.kaiserelementary.org](http://www.kaiserelementary.org). Look for a link called “Pyramid of Intervention.”

Teachers also provide education and supervision around the development of social skills. They teach Second Step lessons to the class and have class meetings to discuss bullying or other social problems. This week we had sessions with classes with Kidpower. The presenter talked about how to be safe in relationships and on the playground. Teachers received information to use with their classes. Next Monday, March 29, will be Cesar Chavez day, and there will be no school. It’s also an opportunity to find out a little about the Latino labor hero to whom we owe so much. With Dolores Huerta he founded the Farm Workers’ Union and furthered the rights of farm workers across our country. Google him with your child and see what you can find!

Friday night was the Vernal Equinox, the beginning of spring, the date when day and night are equal. Look around, the hills are green and dotted with wildflowers and daffodils. The weather is absolutely fabulous and the kids a bit more rambunctious! It’s also the pagan celebration of Ostara, which celebrates fertility and that light is overcoming darkness. It’s a time of planting and tending gardens, of new beginnings and new actions. This holiday was made into the Christian holiday of Easter, another celebration of new life.

Some of the first-graders pointed out a wild tom turkey on the hill the other day. His tail was spread and he was calling for a mate. Take a minute, look out your window; see a miracle of new beginnings. Happy Easter, happy Passover, happy spring!



# Elementary Music Festival at Kaiser on April 1



For the past 12 years, Oakland Unified School District elementary music teachers have produced an Elementary Music Festival for their young musicians to perform for classmates from neighboring OUSD schools. Formerly known as the “Solo and Ensemble Festival,” the event has transformed over the past few years into what is now simply referred to as the Elementary Music Festival.

The Music Festival is held annually, usually the week before Spring Break, at 10-15

OUSD schools, and involves 18 music teachers, 45 schools, and over 2,000 elementary school musicians. At each host school site, there are 2-3 additional participating schools, each of which have approximately 30 minutes of total performance time. Performances can involve any *number* of performers—full-ensemble, solo performances, small group performing ensembles (duets, trios, quartets, etc.)—in a variety of categories (band, orchestra, guitar, choir/vocal, and percussion). The number and combination of performers, and the type of music performed, is chosen by the music director of each participating school. At some festival sites, all participants will join together at the end of the concert to perform the same piece of music, in the same spirit of OUSD’s Jazz and Orchestra Festivals, which have featured combined, large-group finale performances at the end of these concerts for the past 8 years.

In addition to furthering the Music Festival tradition in OUSD Music Programs, the Elementary Music Festival provides a performance opportunity to OUSD’s budding young musicians to share and celebrate their talents with each other and with classmates from other OUSD schools. It is also a great collaborative opportunity for our music teachers to work together toward our common goal, vision, and passion for providing a comprehensive music education for every child, grades K-5, in the Oakland Public Schools.

Kaiser’s Music Festival is April 1, from 1 to 2:45 p.m.
